

Donations

Thanks also to our committed **regular monthly donors**, the average for the year was £400 per month and with new supporters and increases from existing ones the figure is now just under has £500 per month as we start the next financial year. Your support is vital and as we move towards the operational phase of the Child Care Centre it would be great to have an increase in regular donors so we can provide a more stable funding stream and become less reliant on fundraising.

Corporate donors included **Big Rock Performance People Solutions** who very kindly gave us a £1000 donation. Also, in March 16 we received an unexpected donation from offshore, we were beneficiaries of the BP Foundation in Houston Texas to the tune of £720(\$1000) via Charities Aid Foundation [CAF].





SANTROKOFI CHILD CARE CENTRE BUILDING PROJECT

This financial year we spent £8796 on building works and furniture. We have paid 75% of the cost for the perimeter wall around the centre plus the security hut and gates. This work is finished but there a few problems with the contractor to finally resolve and then the balance will be paid. In time for the summer camp in 2015 we paid for 10 bunk beds to be made and installed in the centre.

This year we also supported the change in security, housekeeping and maintenance of the centre. The new arrangements have cost £1236 so far. The LFF have employed a local security watchman from Santrokofi who also looks after the grounds around the centre and has begun farming the land. The LFF has also employed Beatrice Appiah, who lives in the centre keeping it clean. Beatrice is also helping on site with preparations to get the centre ready for its first children. The RHF has set up a small maintenance fund with the LFF so that it can respond quickly to items that need repair / utility bills e.g. roof damage caused by storms; leaking pipes.

Other

Admin charges in FY2015-16 were £334, bank charges including foreign exchange were £264, chilli & quiz evening venue hire was £60 & postage of accounts was £10.

Our balance at end of the year was £12,975. We have set aside £2600 to pay the final payment [25%] to the contractor for completion of the work on the walls. With this the centre is complete and furnishing almost finished. Our next priority is working with the Living Faith Foundation in Ghana and the local welfare services to identify the children most in need. So we shall be specifically designating the majority of this money to making the centre operational and ready to receive its first children. Regular givers now donate £500 per month which really helps us with budgeting. We've set ourselves the target to double this to £1000 as we'll need at least £2000 per month to run the centre for 10 children.

Although there is no summer Camp in 2016, Simon & Bethan Mason are planning a short visit to Ghana on behalf of the RHF Trustees. They'll meet with Agnes and the new LFF Board to encourage them, meet the new committee in Santrokofi and village chiefs and visit the centre to see progress first hand.

Accounts for FY2014/15 have been submitted to the Charity Commission. See their website for further details.
